Individual therapeutic sessions where a student can comfortably confide in their peer counselor. They are confidential.


Participation

Plan fun activities to deepen and strengthen relationships between counselors and peers, as well as just building more friendships.


These are the hex values for the project.















The only shortcoming of the prototype stand was the lack of stability in the cardboard composition. The new stand will be made of plywood. All other aspects will not be changed.

Additionally, fairy lights(from which the images will be hung) will be utilized to create a more comfortable atmosphere.



Materials needed:

- (x1) 36" x 18" Plywood(3/4" thickness)
- (x2) 36" x 24" Plywood(3/4" thickness)
- (x2) 18" x 18" Plywood(3/4" thickness)
- (x1) 36" x 12" Plywood(3/4" thickness)
- (x2) 3" x 3" x 18" Plywood Block
- (x6) $3" \times 3"$ (give or take an inch) door hinges

(xuncertain) 2"-2.5" Nails

(x2) 36" Fairy Lights

What is cross-age peer counseling?



Student body population is too large for counselors to efficiently care for each and every student they are responsible for. Peer counseling can solve that, in addition to empowering students.

With an increase in rates of suicide and school violence, it is so important now, than ever, to care for the mental and emotional health of students.

Similar to peer tutoring, cross-age peer counseling is another opportunity for students to work with and empower each other in social and emotional areas. Cross-age is in reference to the age gap between the older student counselor and younger student patient.

Ex: Junior or senior high school student would be the peer counselor of a freshman student
